1 Welcome by Chairman

2 Apologies: (APM 1/18)

Apologies had been received from Cllr Hutton, Rev S Hadley and County Coouncillor A Maughan. Reason for absence noted and agreed by Council

3 Minutes of the Meeting held on the 15 May 2017: (APM 2/18)

Minutes of the meeting held on the 9 May 2016 were read out by the Chair. These had previously been signed and accepted at the July meeting 2017

4 Presentation of Reports by Village Organisations (APM 3/18)

- Village Hall – J Arnott (see Appendix 2)
- Charities – Presentation given by Alan Thomas. The constitution has been re-drafted and new trustees appointed. Two nominated trustees had been appointed one being a representative from the Parish Council. Two trustees had been co-opted and Rev S Hadley made up the fifth. The charities currently have approx. £19500 on deposit.
Over the year contributions had been made to the Village Hall, the defib and to residents within the village.
- Carlton Scroop PCC – Presentation given by Cllr Naheem (Appendix 3)
- Normanton Churchyard – Cllr R Rainthorpe thanked all those involved in maintaining the churchyard. Monies on deposit amount to well over a £1000. Thanks also given to the Parish Council for their contribution.

The Chairman informed the meeting due to reduction in funding further applications for donations will have to be accompanied by annual accounts.

5 Personal Representation (APM 4/18)

A member of the public raised the issue of having a footpath between the two villages. At present residents have to walk on the road. LCC have previously informed the Parish Council it does not meet the criteria to establish a footpath. It was agreed the Parish Council should approach Cllr Maughan to accompany residents and a member of the Council to see the dangers for himself.

The quality of the highway was also raised. The Chairman informed the meeting representation had already been made to Highways
